- <u>Neighborhood</u>
 - Parks and Community Center 5 min. Note: Additional funding must be secured for each of the proposed projects.
 - Porter Paint site (Kathleen) Environmental review contract awarded to TriEco and report received. LMHA submitted a photo array and other information on the site to the SHPO. SHPO is reviewing and will be making their determination on what archaeological work on the site, if any, may be required prior to demolishing current buildings. Looking at potential mixed use(s) as commercial/park. Will be engaging community in design.
 - Baxter Community Center (**Gretchen**) –Approximately \$1.94M in Choice funds available for this project, however additional funding will be required. Holding community design workshops in coming months.
 - Baxter Square Park (Gretchen) ongoing discussions with Olmstead Conservancy on park improvements
 - Critical Community Improvements (CCIs) 10 min. (Gretchen & Kathleen) Five projects. HUD has requested additional items, including environmental reviews that must be completed before HUD will provide final approval and release funds for each activity.
 - <u>Historic Quinn Chapel Stabilization (Gretchen)</u> stabilization of historically significant structure for future development and reuse. Phase I Environmental study complete. LMG's environmental review is nearing completion. Potentially could go to LMHA's Board for approval in June.
 - <u>Smart City Public Safety</u> (Pam)– installation of 39 cameras, and a public WiFi network. Upfront Wi-Fi costs have increased because the original partner is no longer doing business in Louisville. Requested CCI budget revision from HUD. LMG's environmental review can't be completed until revised budget is approved by HUD.

- <u>The Village @ West Jefferson</u> (Kathleen) –build out of leasehold space in new commercial/retail building. LMG's environmental review is still pending Section 106 approval. Initial archaeological report completed, however SHPO requesting additional mitigation work. Construction costs have increased due to expanded scope of work. Requested CCI budget revision from HUD.
- <u>Business Center & Plaza at LCCC</u> (Kathleen) finishing existing leasehold space in the Business Incubator Center in LCCC's Old Walnut Street campus. Lead report was completed by TriEco and LMG has completed environmental review. Going to LMHA's Board for approval on May 21st. Work can commence upon board approval and execution of drawdown agreement,
- <u>18th Street Corridor Redevelopment (Laura Grabowski)</u> acquisition, landbanking, and the rehabilitation of vacant lots, commercial, owner-occupied and rental-occupied residential structures along 18th Street and the blocks immediately to the east and west. Homeowner rehab program plans to be launched this summer. Details will follow in the near future.














Phased Relocation of Beecher Households






Conceptual Drawing of Porter Paints Site (Mixed Use & Park)
